In 2018 I moved to Sydney, Australia where joined a swim squad called Bondi Fit. I started training alongside the Bondi Lifeguards and instantly fell in love with the ocean and open water swimming. Race season rolled around and I entered lots of races varying from 2-5km much to the disbelief of my old coaches who joked I didn't like swimming for more than 50m! Haha! Swimming helped me find a sort of Aussie 'family' and I made friends for life while I lived on the other side of the planet from my real family.

Recently I moved back to England to start studying Sport and Exercise Science at Exeter University. I now swim with Exe Masters and I have managed to carry on open water swimming in England. My first race back in the UK I came 1st in my age group at the Henley Mile. Recently I completed a 5km in 15C water at Lake Windermere.
